**Part time, 14hrs a week, 12 months temporary contract (potential continuation dependant on confirmation of funding).**

**Salary: £19,100 pro rata. There is also the possibility of carry out this work on a self-employed basis.**

**Location: Black Isle Cares office, Fortrose. Some flexibility for home working. Travel around Black Isle may be required. A milage allowance is available.**

BIC has worked in partnership with Fortrose Academy and the Black Isle Youth Development workers to carry out intergenerational activities such as weekly board game afternoons, lunches, meals on wheels deliveries and a choir who performed at the Christmas concert in 2019. We would like to develop the intergenerational aspects of our current services, in particular Meals on Wheels and Befriending, linking older people with young people of all ages across the Black Isle.

We are also excited to have several partnership projects involving older and younger people that the post holder would be instrumental in:

- Meals on Wheels service in partnership with Calman Trust
- Storytelling project in partnership with Avoch Primary School
- Linking residents at Eilean Dubh care home with young people using Tablets donated by Age Scotland

The successful candidate will be enthusiastic about forming positive relationships with older and younger people and enjoy working collaboratively with partners. They will have excellent interpersonal and communication skills, both written and verbal,

including the use of social media. The post will work mainly from the BIC office. A full driving licence and access to a car would be an advantage.
